

FORT WILDERNESS' MISSION: Fort exists to present the gospel of Jesus Christ and to edify believers through God's Word, Adventure Programs, the Wilderness and Relationships. Our full-time missionary staff and summer staff are the real hands and feet that carry out that mission to love people well in Jesus' name. We provide the following information to guide you to understand if you fit what is required for a certain position. It serves as a basic guide and may change. Training will be provided at Fort before serving to prepare you for service once accepted as a leader on summer staff. Applying for summer staff is making a commitment to give your best every day.

Nursing Assistant

Qualifications:

1. Required to have completed 3rd year of nursing program, Pharmacology and have Basic Life Support certification (BLS)

Responsible to: Health Services Manager

- 2. Takes initiative, has good problem-solving skills, flexible and trustworthy
- 3. Has good patient and situation assessment skills and basic knowledge of First Aid
- 4. Has excellent communication skills, able to have a positive attitude and be a team player
- 5. Able to maintain professional relationship while serving peers (HIPPA guidelines, etc.)
- 6. Has the desire to sacrificially serve both campers and staff

Ministerial Responsibilities:

- 1. Assessment of illness or injury and administration of treatment per standard order protocols
- 2. Dispensing all scheduled medications to summer staff and volunteers
- 3. Accurate record keeping and documentation of patient care
- 4. Assist with volunteer Nurses at Adventure Outpost, orientate, check in with them, and restock infirmary, as needed
- 5. Coordinate staffers trips to urgent care and on the occasion, accompany the staff
- 6. On call when Health Services Manager is off duty
- 7. Provide care for campers (depending on availability)
- 8. Keep inventory of infirmary supplies, and restock First Aid kits as needed
- 9. Maintain and coordinate the cleanliness of the infirmary spaces

In addition to job specific qualifications, all leadership staff at Fort must have the following qualifications:

- · Is a professing Christian, committed in both spirit and practice
- · Sincere and current walk with the Lord and desire to show that to others
 - Desire to impact other people for the Kingdom of God by sharing the gospel, leading devotions, sharing testimony, prayer, etc

- · Will embrace and live out Fort's values
- · Mature; responsible; independent, takes initiative
- · Be flexible and willing to do whatever is asked
 - Be an example of one who is God honoring in all things and who works hard with a Godly attitude
- · Demonstrates leadership skills and abilities
- · Ability to communicate well with children and adults

Leadership Responsibilities: Most work areas at Main Camp have a need for summer-long paid leaders to serve as crew head(s) to work with volunteers. In addition to the work responsibilities listed in that work area, the following responsibilities shall be required for **ALL** leaders:

- Lead volunteer staff on one's crew prepare/lead devotions; initiate spiritual discussions
- Help campers and staff feel loved and at home
- Encourage teammates during and after work
- Prepare for and participate actively in planned Bible studies
- Attend weekly leaders' gatherings/meetings
- Disciple another summer staffer or volunteer (if asked)
- Show initiative in keeping a clean and orderly living area
- Be a role model in following the Summer Staff Manual
