A few things to note:

- Laundry: The program is three weeks long and we don't do laundry until the Saturday of
 the 2nd week because we are on a canoe trip for 4 days during the 2nd week, so bring
 enough clothes, but also remember that there is limited room in the cabins. Bring your
 own sleeping bag or bedding and pillow.
- 2. **Money:** How much money to bring? There may be a few places to spend money while at Lab. We **may** stop at the Canteen or Campgrounds at Main Camp. We won't hold on to your money unless you ask us to, I will remind you of that during the first day. The only other time you would have to spend money is for washing and drying clothes, so a roll of quarters would be a good idea.
- 3. **Clothing:** We do some service projects for camp a few afternoons, so old clothes and work gloves would be handy. We have a special banquet meal the final night, so nicer clothes are encouraged, but you don't need to go all out. Usually, Labbers and staff dress up a bit for dinner and pictures.
